

Econ 102 Introduction to Economics II (4-2) 5

COURSE DESCRIPTION: This is an introductory undergraduate course on macroeconomics. It introduces the basic ideas in macroeconomic theory on how the economy works as a whole. Topics covered include national output, unemployment, inflation, the exchange rate and balance-of-payments. The roles of the government and Central Bank in the economy are also discussed.
