

Econ 101 Introduction to Economics I (4-2) 5

COURSE DESCRIPTION: This is an introductory undergraduate course on microeconomics. It introduces the basic ideas in microeconomic theory on consumer and firm behavior and government policy. Topics covered include demand-supply analysis, consumer theory (utility maximization), firm theory (production and cost), perfectly and imperfectly competitive markets and the role of government in the economy.
